

Library turns outward

The Library is currently in the middle of our strategic planning process. We are employing the Harwood Institute approach, which asks libraries to turn outward to their communities in every way. This means that rather than asking what people want in a *library*, we ask people what they want in their ideal community, and we identify themes and consistent issues or aspirations. Then, we find ways for the Library to meet the needs of the community. Research has shown that strategic plans built on this method are more successful, engagement with the Library becomes richer and more meaningful, and people learn more about all of the ways libraries can benefit them.

We have conducted one-on-one interviews at farmer's markets, Camas Days, and in the community with staff, Trustees, and Friends and Foundation board members. But it's not too late to participate. Just click the *Gimme 5!* button to the right, or go to our website, and complete our online survey, which will be live through August.

The next stage of the strategic planning process will be speaking with different community groups, as input from group conversations can also be extremely beneficial.

We will then begin building our new mission and vision statements. We plan to have the new strategic plan ready to implement for 2019.

A new catalog for 2019

We've had many questions about the preparations we're making for our new catalog. The images below are from a bookmark we've been giving out at the Library, as it best describes the Library's transition. We are happy to answer questions in person, too. We want to make this process as easy as possible for you!

Camas Public Library & Andrew Catalog System

For many years, Camas Library, an independent city library, has shared a catalog system with Fort Vancouver Regional Libraries (FVRL). Over the years, Camas Library has evolved and changed and so have the needs of our community. In order to better serve our patrons with the best technology and library collections curated just for Camas, the Library will be moving to our own catalog software system beginning in 2019. This means moving records out of the catalog shared with FVRL, and several other changes you'll see in the coming months. Our patrons come first, so please let us know how we can help you through this transition. We promise, it will be worth the wait!

RESERVING BOOKS

You can reserve items from any library; however, if it's a Camas item, you must pick it up in Camas. If it's a Fort Vancouver item, you must choose a Fort Vancouver location to pick it up at, like Washougal or Cascade Park.

IF CAMAS DOESN'T OWN A BOOK YOU WANT

You want to pick the item up at Camas, but don't see what you want? Please let us know. We take requests! We will also work with InterLibrary Loan to find your item and make sure we get it for you.

RETURNS

Returns can still be made at any library, no matter which home library they belong to, or which home library you belong to. We'll make sure they get back to where they belong!

WHY THE CHANGE?

Having a shared catalog has many benefits, but being able to respond to the unique needs of the Camas community through our own catalog brings even more. Please see the reverse side for more details.





FACTS ABOUT THE NEW CATALOG

TWO CARDS FOR FREE

Anyone living in Cama

Anyone living in Camas, Washougal, Vancouver, or any of the Fort Vancouver areas will be able to get both a Camas library card and a Fort Vancouver library card.

SEARCH FOR EVERYTHING ALL AT ONCE

When you look for books and DVDs, ebooks and e-audiobooks will also appear in your search results. You can download straight from there!

COMMUNITY PROFILES

Local organizations can create profiles, so if you're interested in, say, beekeeping--you'll see books. DVDs and also community groups that meet...all in your search results.

SUGGEST PURCHASES ONLINE

If we don't have what you need, you can let us know through the catalog via the InterLibrary Loan or Suggestion for Purchase forms.

VIRTUAL BOOKSHELVES

Want to see what else we have on the shelf?
Look up one book, then click "See Full Shelf".
Browse the shelves in real time!

REVIEW YOUR BOOKS

Keep lists of what you've read, review them, post your picks to social media, and share with other Camas Library users.

FOLLOW YOUR FAVORITE READER

Find another library-goer or staff member who reads the same kind of books you like, and follow their reviews!

Book Displays:

Let's get visual

The Display Team recently took a webinar on visual merchandising, which caught like wildfire to the rest of the staff. It even inspired a new team devoted entirely to the user experience inside the building, aptly named UX. The ideas are simple, and bookstores have been using them for years. The rules are as follows:

Pyramids

All materials on display by height in the shape of a pyramid.

Facing and Fronting

Face the covers out as much as possible, flat on a table or standing up.

Balance and Symmetry

Symmetry is key; evenly distribute materials throughout the display.

Straight Lines

Create clean lines and adjust constantly.

Recovery

Any and all staff members responsible for adjustment and realignment of displays.


