Ordinance No. 151.

The city council of the city of Camas, Washington, do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. That whereas it appears to the council after a due hearing thereon that a portion of what appears on the plat of Cowan's addition to the city of Camas, Washington, to be Columbia street, is of no use to the said city and has never and never can be used as a public street, and the same has been considered and improved as private property and it is to the best in erests of the said city that the said street be vacated.

SEC. 2. That heretofore a petition was filed herein asking for the vacation of the said portion of Columbia street referred to in section one hereof; which said portion is specifically described as follows: Beginning at a point 125 feet south of the northeast corner of block 17 of Cowan's addition to the city of Camas; thence south 50 feet; thence southwesterly 93.41 feet to the south line of said block 17; thence northeasterly 117.13 feet to the place of beginning, containing 2250 square feet.

SEC. 3. And thereupon on the 8th day of September, 1914, at a regular meeting of the said council a resolution was passed setting the 29th day of September, 1914, at the hour of 8 o'clock p. m., as the time for hearing on the said petition; and that the clerk was therein directed to and by proofs adduced to this body he did, give the notice of the said hearing as required by law.

SEC. 4. It is now, therefore, ordained and declared that the said above described portion of Columbia street be and it is hereby vacated and the interest or easement of the city of Camas, if any it has, reverts to the owner of the abutting property in the manner provided by law.

SEC. 5. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
